INDIVIDUAL PERFORMANCE AND PROGRESS – KEY COMPETENCIES

When you are a teacher, you delight in seeing children making improvements (even the smallest improvements matter) and you are also so excited to see children delight in their endeavours and successes. Last Tuesday was no exception when, whilst on lunchtime duty a girl who practises gymnastics for hours a week sought me out to show me how she can now perform a backward flip to a 10/10 standard. She landed it! She was delightfully excited that she had managed to achieve her goal. I have witnessed many other similar feats this week such as children who three weeks couldn't walk on very high stilts or ride a unicycle or recite their lines for the senior syndicate production – yes you are correct – they can now do so!!! These precious moments matter to parents, children and their teachers (principal!).

I frequently see such treasured moments, moments that are hard to record in a written mid-year or end-of-year report.

Many such moments can be relayed when teachers meet with parents informally or at formal interviews. I would encourage you to book an interview with your child's teachers.

Also, please remember to look closely at your child's report and look beyond the 3 National Standards categories of 'Well Below', 'Below', 'At' and 'Above' for Literacy and Mathematics. Although these are important, our focus on the five Key Competencies (Managing Self, Relating to others, Thinking, Participating and Contributing, and Using language, symbols and texts) is of major importance as we promote 'well-rounded' students and citizens.

YOUTH ORCHESTRA

Last Tuesday our children were treated to a performance by the Nelson School of Music Junior Youth Orchestra. As a follow up the School of Music provided us with some information about how they can join this group.

The orchestra currently holds weekly rehearsals during term time at the Hearing House (corner of Trafalgar Street and Synagogue Lane) on Tuesdays from 3.30 – 4.20pm. Children are welcome to go along and listen to a rehearsal or take along an instrument and join in. This is a great opportunity for children to make new friends and to participate in an activity which will help build their confidence as a player and as a person. The atmosphere in the rehearsals is both relaxed and encouraging.


