<p>Historical position: 2020 saw a significant drop in the overall percentage to 69.3% of children 'At' or 'Above' the Curriculum Levels performance (from the historical overall percentage of around 80%). 2021 saw an improvement (73.4%) but this is still well below historical percentages. - **There are 17 Pasifika students in the school - 9 are in the 'At' or 'Above' categories (52.9%), boys 42.9%, girls 60%. This needs to be a target group 2023 (especially the boys).**

Analysis of Variance/Recommendations:

With our first target the overall percentage 73.8% was similar to 2022 (75.2%) but target wasn't achieved:

“ To significantly boost the percentage of children ‘At’ or ‘Above’ the applicable Curriculum Levels of performance for their year groups, by 1st November 2023. The main target groups being especially Year 3s 2023 (63.7% as Year 2s 2022) and Year 4s 2023 (63.2% as Year 3s 2022).”

Our Year 2s 2022 ‘At’ or ‘Above’ improved from 63.7% to 65.7% as Year 3s and our Year 3s 2022 were virtually the same - 63.6% 2022, 67.1 2023%. Our Year 3 boys improved from 51.4% to 60.6%. This improvement is very pleasing and indicative of our teaching efforts to improve the overall percentages. We recognise there is definitely a need to continue this target again next year.

And secondly,

“To boost the number of Pasifika pupils ‘At’ or ‘Above’ the applicable Curriculum Levels of performance for their year groups (by 1st November 2023), from 52.9% to 70% (17 Pasifika students 2022).”

This target wasn't achieved.

The percentage of the current 16 Pasifika children ‘At’ or ‘Above’ remained pretty much the same at 50.0% (52.9% 2022), boys only 40% and girls 54.6%. What is pleasing is this is the overall percentage is much better than the 2021 percentage of 31%. Still need to target these children in the future.

Future directions:

- For 2024, there needs to be a Reading Target for Years 2, 3, 4 and 5s overall and especially the Year 2, 4 and 5 boys (as Year 1s - 63.3%, Year 3s - 60.6% and Year 4s - 63.2%).
- The Pasifika students need to remain a target group in 2024.
- We have successfully applied to be part of the 'Better Start Literacy Approach' starting February 2024. We will have 2 facilitators in training and 6 classroom teachers involved.
- Jess O'Connor will be training to be another Reading Recovery teacher 2024.
- The Middle syndicate teachers will be all trained (some have already) in the CODE programme and will be instituting this in their classrooms during 2024.

It is pleasing to report the overall percentage of children 'At' or 'Above' (77.4%) in writing in 2022 has increased slightly from the 2021 and 2020 percentages. This is pleasing considering the teachers have been doing their utmost to boost performances, in spite of the COVID and other sicknesses being prevalent again this year especially during early 2022.

When one drills down into the differences where the percentages are significantly lower than the others. The boys at 3 levels need to be targeted in 2023. Namely, the Year 3 boys (60% 2022 as Year 2s), Year 4 boys (70.6% as Year 3s 2022) and Year 6 boys (65.8% as Year 5s 2022).

Analysis of Variance/Recommendations:

Unfortunately, our overall percentage (73.3%) was slightly down on last year's one (77.4%). So our target was not achieved.

“To significantly boost the percentage of children ‘At’ or ‘Above’ the applicable Writing Curriculum Levels of performance for their year groups, by 1st November 2023 (especially Year 3, 4 and 6 boys)”.

In terms of our target boys' groups the percentage of our year levels 'At' or 'Above' were mixed. The Year 3 boys' percentage was 69.7% (60% 2022 as Year 2s), Year 4 boys' only 43% (70.6% as Year 3s 2022) and Year 6 boys' only 38.1% (65.8% as Year 5s 2022). The latter two were very disappointing. We still need to target these children in the future.

And secondly,

“ To boost the number of Pasifika pupils ‘At’ or ‘Above’ the applicable Writing Curriculum Levels of performance for their year groups (by 1st November 2022), from 58.8% (2022) to 70% and significantly improve boys' percentage (42.9% 2022)”.

This target wasn't achieved.

The percentage of the current 16 Pasifika children 'At' or 'Above' was even less the 2022 percentage - 43.8% 2023 (50.1% 2022). The girls' percentage was 54.6% but the boys' percentage was only 20%. Need to target these children in the future.

Future directions:

- For 2024, there needs to be a Writing Target since **27.7%** of all children are 'Well Below' or 'Below' the Curriculum Level for their age.

- **The two year levels of concern being the Year 4s – 56.5% and the Year 6s – 51.1%.** Both percentages are significantly lower than the average (73.3%). **The Year 6s have moved onto intermediate schooling so the Year 5s 2024 group need to be a target group.**
- Also, the target cohorts for 2024 being Year 2 boys 2023 – **71.8%**, Year 3 boys 2023 – **69.7%** and Year 4 2023 – **45.3%**.
- The Pasifika students need to remain a target group in 2024.
- We have successfully applied to be part of the 'Better Start Literacy Approach' starting February 2024. We will have 2 facilitators in training and 6 classroom teachers involved.
- Jess O'Connor will be training to be another Reading Recovery teacher 2024.
- The Middle syndicate teachers will be all trained (some have already) in the CODE programme and will be instituting this in their classrooms during 2024.
